HEALTH & SAFETY PROCEDURES

We are looking forward to welcoming campers back to the Adler Arts Center this summer!

The Adler Arts Center is closely following the current health guidelines to ensure a safe experience for campers during their Camp Adler sessions. Safety is our top priority, and we are continuing to follow best practices to mitigate the spread of communicable diseases.

These guidelines are subject to change or modify in response to updates from federal and local entities. They adhere to guidelines provided by the CDC and IDPH.

MASK USAGE GUIDELINES:

Outdoor Mask Usage

Masks are no longer mandated outdoors and will not be required while outdoors for Camp Adler campers. However, if an individual is not fully vaccinated, we recommend that they mask outdoors if possible.

Indoor Mask Usage:

Masks will be required indoors for all participants of Camp Adler. Masks must fit correctly and cover the nose and mouth. Staff members may remind youth and adults to put on their masks when necessary, social distance when necessary, and wash and/or sanitize hands regularly. We ask for compliance and cooperation with all staff directives.

HEALTH MONITORING:

Before leaving for camp, all participants and visitors should conduct a self-screening for COVID-19 symptoms. If any participant or members of their household are suffering from COVID-19 symptoms, or have come into contact with a person who has received a positive COVID-19 test in the last 14 days, please do not come to camp and call the office at 847-367-0707.

Upon arrival at camp, our staff will be conducting health checks to ensure that all campers and guests are healthy and show no signs of COVID-19. All campers will be asked if they have any of the following symptoms:



- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting or diarrhea

If a student(s) states that they are experiencing any of the above symptoms upon arrival at camp, and parent will be called to pick up camper. A negative COVID-19 test will be required to return to Camp Adler.

At any time during the session, if your student begins to experience the above symptoms, is tested positive for COVID-19, or is exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, call The Adler Arts Center office **immediately** at 847-367-0707 to report the possible exposure to our students and staff.

SAFETY PROCEDURES:

- Everyone at The Adler Arts Center, including staff, faculty, students, parents, and guests, will be required to wear a mask while indoors.
- The Adler Arts Center faculty and staff is trained in hygiene practices and will be sanitizing our studios on an hourly basis.
- Camp enrollment will be capped at 48 students per session. Each squad will be capped at 15 people (12 campers, 1 counselor, 1 junior counselor, 1 faculty member).
 - Our enrollment caps will help us maintain good ventilation and social distancing when using our indoor classrooms.
- Campers will check-in with their counselor each morning where they will be asked if they are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms.
 - Campers will remain with their squad in their designated zones for the duration of each day.
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- Campers will be socially distanced during lunch time and water breaks if not able to eat outdoors.
- Each squad will have its own individual outdoor and indoor studios, as well as a designated bathroom and separate water cooler.
- Art and performance faculty will rotate through each squad's zone, offering each squad age-appropriate curricula in visual and performing arts. Campers will check-out with their counselor at the end of each day.

If an individual reports symptoms while on premises of Adler Arts Center, precautions to respectfully isolate and help individual prevent further spread of virus will be taken. A parent or emergency contact will be called immediately to pick up.

- In this case, we will ask the individual to quarantine for a 14-day period as recommended by the CDC or until a negative COVID-19 test result is received.

The Adler Arts Center will notify all individuals who have had contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19.

- Individuals who have been exposed will be asked to quarantine for a 14-day period as recommended by the CDC or until a negative COVID-19 test result is received.

Tuition is non-refundable even in the instance of COVID-19 contraction or exposure. Only those who purchase Camp Adler insurance will receive a prorated refund.
