



We are looking forward to returning to in-person lessons and continuing to provide your student(s) with quality music instruction and performance opportunities this year!

To make in-person lessons as safe as possible, we are implementing required safety procedure and ask all families to read the following updates to our normal day-to-day operations.

HEALTH MONITORING:

Students are asked to self-monitor for the following symptoms:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting or diarrhea

If a student(s) has had any of the listed symptoms OR if anyone living in the same household has exhibited symptoms or tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days we ask that you DO NOT attend lessons in person. Please call the Adler Arts Center at 847-367-0707 and we will coordinate virtual lessons.

At any time during the session, if your student begins to experience the above symptoms, is tested positive for COVID-19, or is exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, we ask that you call The Adler Arts Center office to report the possible exposure to our students and staff.



- If possible, on 2 (total) people permitted in each studio at a time: the student and the teacher.
 - A parent may stay IF it is necessary but must wear a face covering.
- Everyone at The Adler Arts Center, including staff, faculty, students, parents, and guests, will be required to wear a mask while on campus and in their lessons, except for voice students.
 - Voice lessons will be held in larger rooms (Ballroom and Studio Monet) allowing for social distancing.
- Students will be required to use hand sanitizer upon entering their studio.
- The Adler Arts Center faculty and staff is trained in hygiene practices and will be sanitizing our studios on an hourly basis. Piano keys will be cleaned between each student.

The Adler Arts Center has always been a place of art, music, and community. With your help and adherence to these safety measures we can continue to be here for you and the wider community.
